For those who didn't make it you missed a fabulous show - the place was buzzing.....there are photos of some of the exhibits in the Autumn Flower Arranger Magazine and many more on social media

- Nearly 250 competitors
- More than 100 awards
- 10 show judges
- 2 arbitrators

- 9 demonstrations
- 3 talks
- 22 workshops
- 188 musicians providing entertainment,
- 1 stunning floral installation by Elizabeth Newcombe who will represent UK and Ireland at the Interflora World Cup in September

#### Meeting the National Team

Following the discussions held at our Club Representatives Forums in both April and July, the Cheshire Area Leadership team were invited to join a zoom meeting of the NAFAS Board on Friday 14<sup>th</sup> July at 11am. Included in the attendees were; Steven Lane (CEO), Katherine Kear (National Chair), Nicky Wylie (National Vice-Chair), Lilias Hoskins (National President). We had a one-hour time slot. We were able to present all our key messages, our feelings, concerns, requesting greater transparency regarding financials and to ask the main question 'what does HQ actually do that benefits the members'. The matter of Affiliation Fees (being paid more than once by some members) was also raised. We made it clear that it was not the absolute amount of Affiliation Fees that was the problem but the transparency of what it was actually spent on.

As the saying goes, 'Rome wasn't built in a day'. These discussions WILL be continuing and Steven Lane has emailed the team subsequently to continue the discussions and to address our concerns. The one-hour time slot only enabled us to 'scratch the surface'. One trustee did suggest a visit to London – it might come to this! To be continued.....
